<u>BERGER, Earl</u>. Installed several organs in MN. Active 1970s-1980s.

<u>BURFEIND, Murray Albert</u> (deceased). Goodhue, MN. Active 1960s-1990s. Renovated the Kilgen organ at Sheldon Theater, Red Wing, MN.

FELLOWS, Arthur (deceased) Former Casavant Rep.

<u>FRUHSTUCK</u> PIPE ORGAN SERVICE (Charles Fruhstuck) (deceased)

FRYKMAN, John (deceased) Reuter representative, died 2008.

<u>GOULD</u>, Clarence (deceased) Former Moller installer. Active 1950s-1980s.

<u>HAUGH</u>, Martha (deceased). Known for carrying her vacuum and keeping pipe chambers spotless! (Some referred to her as "Organ Annie")

<u>HENDRICKSON</u> ORGAN CO. (St. Peter, MN). (Charles Hendrickson) (died 2021). Active 1960s-2005.

HOLMGREN, Harold (Kilgen rep in Mpls.). Active 1920s-1960s. Died 1984.

<u>IVERSON</u>, Harry O. (deceased). Former Rep. for several companies, including Moller and Wicks. Active 1930s-1950s.

<u>LURTH</u>, Robert (deceased) (Active: 1960s-1990s) (Mankato, MN)

NELSON ORGAN CO. (Wolverton, MN). Michael D. N. Nelson. Active in 1987.

<u>OBERMEYER</u>, Johnny (deceased) (Active: 1950s-1990s). Representative for Schlicker and Moller.

<u>RUTZ</u>, Roland (retired) (Morristown, MN) Active: 1980s-2020.

SCHULZ, Gordon. Active 1950s-1980s.

<u>ULM ORGELWERKE</u> (New Ulm, MN). Howard Nolte.

VanDAALEN, Jan. Born 1938 in Amsterdam, The Netherlands. Worked for Fonteyn en Gaal of Amsterdam, 1954-1958 and 1961-1964; with E. F. Walcker & Cie. of Ludwigsburg (West Germany), 1958-1960; Masters exam at Ludwigsburg School of Music Instrument Building, 1960; with Hallman Organbuilding Co., Kitchener, Ontario, Canada, 1964-1968; established Van Daalen Organbuilding of Minneapolis, Minnesota in 1969 and active until 1989. Representative of the Van Daalen firm of 's-Hertogenbosch, Netherlands (in Prescott, Arizona, by 1996).

VOGELPOHL [& SONS] & SPAETH. Active from 1890-1921 including several generations. Partnership of Herman H. Vogelpohl and Jacob C. Spaeth from 1890-1913; succeeded by H. H. Vogelpohl & Sons.
